CITY OF MILACA SPECIAL COUNCIL MINUTES

August 12, 2024

Pledge of Allegiance

Call to Order Roll Call

Mayor Dillan called the meeting of the Milaca City Council to order at 5:30 p.m.

Upon roll call, the following council members were present: Mayor Dave Dillan, Councilors: Norris Johnson, Lindsee Larsen, Ken Muller and Laurie Gahm.

Staff present: City Manager Tammy Pfaff, City Treasurer Elizabeth Nealley, Public Works Superintendent Gary Kirkeby, Police Chief Quinn Rasmussen

City Manager Pfaff stated this meeting was to discuss the 2025 Preliminary Budget. The reason I am not recommending any large equipment purchases for any department is because we need to build up the funds again for the 2027 project coming up so we don't have to bond so much.

Bill Singer, our insurance representative, estimated health insurance increase of 17% - mostly due to large claims.

Here are some things the council will need to consider:

Sidewalk along 1st St W from Central Ave to Chapmans—engineers estimated at \$250,000 Mayor Dillan stated that seemed like a lot just for sidewalks but Gary Kirkeby stated that it would include alley aprons and each intersection would have a little bump out. City Manager stated there would also be some curb stops repaired.

Street Development to Pearson Property Development – A lot of fill from the airport project is being hauled in there and that is free. Mayor Dillan stated he has received a lot of questions on it from the public as to wondering what is going in there. Gary Kirkeby stated Dean is doing a project down at the school and is hauling some dirt out here too.

Street Maintenance – We won't do any alleys next year.

Fire Trucks – In the process of being built. We just sent them a check for \$190,000.00. Chassis is finally in. They have \$573,000 in their Reserve Fund. If they don't donate anymore money to the city from the Fire Relief, they will be \$126,000 short. Council will have to decide if we pass that on to the townships or do we spend-down cash. I do anticipate more donation so we will wait and see. Townships were not happy about the pumper truck as they stated they were not informed and I was getting phone calls from townships. Gahm questioned if billing our services for fire was getting better. Tammy Pfaff stated that has been good for a while. The Fire Department was not awarded the FEMA grant for the other fire truck they were trying for. They may have to retry. But it sounds like our portion would be the \$25,000 that was in the 2024 budget. They may be depleting their reserves. Mayor Dillan stated that if they don't get that \$25,000 grant and that was in the budget, we could use that towards the pumper truck? City Manager asked the grant? Mayor Dillan stated no, wasn't the \$25,000 in the budget by us - in our budget -then if they don't buy the truck, then wouldn't that cover the pumper truck? City Manager Pfaff stated yes it could.

City Hall Improvements – We did not get the OSHA grant for the front reception area. We will try again. I put over \$62,000 based on quotes this year for the security glass and enclose area. Mayor Dillan questioned what enclose area was. City Manager Pfaff stated it's taking that big window and enclosing it smaller.

Police Department – They will have pistol replacements but they will be trading in their Glocks Police Chief Rasmussen stated most Glocks are 10 years old. They will also be adding an additional officer to get back to the two mid-shifts. Officer Jeff Shaw will be retiring in 2025.

Water Line to the City Development – Pearson Property- we need to give a different name instead of Pearson Property. Give me some ideas. Councilmember Muller suggested Milaca Junction Addition. Everyone like that. Mayor Dillan questioned water line to the development are you talking just to the edge of the property as he thought there was one there already. Kirkeby stated there is a water line in the liquor store parking lot and we would just be extending that. City Manager stated that is included in the CIP. I talked with TSG and advised them it may be a year before this land gets developed and they said they would wait. Another option is to put in a dirt road with the water and sewer under the road and then pave it at a later date. Councilmember Johnson commented that the fill would need to be compacted first. City Manager stated the road would have to skirt the wetland area.

Water Rate Study – we are still giving them information but that should be done in November. I am hoping for a gradual increase. This study will be helpful with the projects that are needed in the future. Street projects, sidewalk, 3rd Ave in 2026. You don't have to do these projects – they can be delayed a year. The reason that this estimate of cost is done is so we can look at in 2027 the Hwy. 23 improvements will be \$100,000 from each water and sewer and that would leave \$520,000 that we will likely have to bond for. For the Street Sidewalks (\$250,000), we have \$3.8 million in RBC investments and we could pull one CD for \$250,000 for this project and it would barely impact as we get \$13,000 a month in interest. We will not get penalized for pulling a CD.

10th Ave and 5th – that's the bypass area. Maybe wait until the project is over and take a look at that one and see what needs to be done out there.

Contracts – the attorney contract will be \$72,000, garbage expires the end of this year

Wages – I am recommending to the council to consider staying in with the union increases for the non-union staff. Mayor Dillan questioned if she meant staying in the same process? City Manager Pfaff stated they go 3.5 and then 1% in July. Gahm asked how many non-union people we have and City Manager Pfaff stated we only have 5 union. If you go full mid-shift then we will have 6 next year. Mayor Dillan stated the only union are the police officers but not Chief Rasmussen as he is in a supervisory position.

Transition Aid – low income housing. We have a good majority of Section 8. This \$11,107 would be shifted over to all the taxpayers because they are giving the low income properties a tax break and we have no choice – we have to do this. And it happens in 2025 and 2026. We get the \$11,000 in our LGA so to offset it we can lower the levy by the \$11,107 to try to help the impact to the taxpayers. We get the revenue, and we are lowering the levy to offset that.

City Manager touched on revenues. Stated someone has contacted her and is interested in building a hangar out at the airport. There is about \$8,300 in Accounts Receivable that is outstanding. Gorecki Center is rented out all the time. Councilmember Larsen questioned if that \$8,300 was for fire calls not paid and asked if we could go after their tax returns? City Manager Pfaff stated it was and we could and that we send to collections. Councilmember Gahm asked if people were being more responsible or why is there a decrease in tickets? City Manager Pfaff stated they are catching on.

City Manager Pfaff stated if we start developing that property, we could start selling those lots right away. We would have to plat the land. We are having the survey done right now. City Manager Pfaff asked the council if we should wait for people to come to us or do we plat it out ahead of time at 1-2 acre lots? Mayor Dillan stated we could do a coming soon sign or something like that. Councilmember Larsen stated to go to Realtor.com and type in Milaca and you can see all the coming soon properties. Mayor Dillan stated Sam would help us too. City Manager Pfaff stated you have to put out an RFQ-Request for Qualifications for realtors, they put in their qualification, it goes to council and council decides who they want. Councilmember Johnson stated that he thought a lot of businesses would have a very specific footprint of what they need so he suggested to wait for businesses to contact us.

Councilmember Gahm asked what the other fund was. City Manager Pfaff stated that gets transferred from the Gambling for Trails and winter help.

Cash is about \$900,000 in sewer. We have a big debt payment in water coming up so that one is about down to \$500,000. That's why water rates will be important going forward.

Mayor Dillan questioned if we could apply for a grant again for the front office safety glass and City Manager Pfaff stated yes and that we would be.

Public Works will need a new boiler. Boiler is original so it is about 50 years old.

No Park improvements. Finish up pickle ball. Councilmember Gahm mentioned how nice it is down there.

City Manager Pfaff stated if we don't do the new clear zone area for the airport, we lose 10 points on our grant applications.

City Manager stated our Gambling fund has about \$42,000 and that has been dwindling.

Mayor Dillan questioned the balance of the Veterans Memorial. City Manager Pfaff stated they have about \$2,178.

Water Fund - City Manager Pfaff stated we will need to do a water rate increase. She further stated the water tower will need to be repainted in 2027 that could be 1.2 to 1.5 million. 2027 is going to be a large expenditure year.

Sewer Fund: Again, we will need to increase rates.

Liquor – I did an analysis on this and this fund is down \$43,000 from the previous year. Beer and tobacco are down. THC sales are making up for it so our net loss is only \$23,000. We are hoping holiday sales will help. Vicki does not have anything for projects next year.

Some discussion in regard to the levy. Levy is currently at 8.01, down from 8.34 when Councilmembers Johnson and Muller met with City Manager Pfaff. Councilmember Gahm asked if this could get lower as residents will be screaming at this. Mayor Dillan stated we need to get this lower. City Manager Pfaff asked what could be cut? This is so thin already. Mayor Dillan asked what the \$62,738 Street Bond is and City Manager Pfaff advised him that is the new street projects.

Motor Vehicle – nothing here. They should be set for a long time. Just maintaining.

Councilmember Gahm asked if increasing water and sewer rates would help the levy. City Manager Pfaff explained it would not because those are enterprise funds and we only transfer from the liquor store to the general fund. We don't transfer from water/sewer funds. They are considered business funds and they have to sustain themselves. Mayor Dillan asked who decides to have the water tower painted and Public Works Superintendent Gary Kirkeby explained that they have been putting it off for three years already and KLM is our water tower engineers and they are recommending it be painted. Phil Gravel looked at the report from KLM and agreed that it needed to be repainted.

Step Schedule – we would do a 4.5 increase the first of the year. City Manager Pfaff stated the salary increases are included in the balanced budget. Mayor Dillan stated he does not have a problem with salary increases but the 3% was supposed to be the steps so we wouldn't have to debate the increase each year. Mayor Dillan stated that with the economy being tight right now, we could add or we could freeze. We have that option too. Councilmember Larsen stated that they would not always get the Cost of Living each year but would get their raise. Councilmember Gahm questioned the 3.5% and then the 4.5% columns. City Manager Pfaff explained that the 4.5% includes the 1.5% COLA with the raise. At this point everyone is in agreeance with this 4.5% increase.

Reserve Fund – This fund would be used, for example, if Public Works needs new equipment, we would take from this fund. Gary has saved the city thousands of dollars by going to the surplus store for things he needs or the city needs.

City Manager Pfaff explained that there is no equipment reserves budgeted for 2025 but if these funds are used, it will take quite a while to get these funds built back up and if they get added into the budget, the levy would increase significantly.

Mayor Dillan questioned what if we don't do the water and sewer extension to the new property. City Manager Pfaff stated then we wouldn't get any tax revenue. Councilmember Johnson stated that that would have to be determined by potential buyers. City Manager Pfaff stated the sooner you can sell a lot, the sooner we can get tax revenue and the sale proceeds going forward.

Councilmember Larsen asked if the sidewalk has to be a sidewalk? Could we just take it out and pave it? Gary Kirkeby stated we should have a sidewalk as there is none on the other side. The road in front of Fransen Decorating was to be done next year, but now it is pushed to 2028. Gary explained that that road would be a complete reconstruct as it needs new water and sewer lines as well.

Councilmember Johnson stated that if we budgeted to take the funds out of General Fund for the infrastructure out at the Milaca Junction Addition, then sell at least one lot next year, that should help. Mayor Dillan asked if we did that, how does that reflect the funds. City Manager Pfaff stated we need 5 months of operating cash and we are at 68% so we could get down to 41%. Mayor Dillan stated he does not want to do that.

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Council may have to explain to residents that there are no major projects in the budget, no major purchases, no reserves money set aside, we do have development property that was have to get developed to get back on the tax rolls and we will have to spend water/sewer funds to get developed.

Discussion about the Highway 23 project and expense for the city. The city would need to pay \$100,000 from each water and sewer funds. We also have the reset of the 3rd for the roundabout and that was estimated at \$520,000. We would also have to figure out street light as that is a city expense. That was estimated at \$200,000. City Manager Pfaff has advised MN Dot that ECE needs to be included in these meetings in regard to lights.

Councilmember Johnson asked if some of these costs for the Milaca Junction Addition could be assessed onto the property or new buyer? City Manager stated it could be assessed. Mayor Dillan stated that was done for Fieldstone Green and Boulder Ridge.

Mayor Dillan questioned Police Chief Rasmussen when the new officer would be hired. Chief Rasmussen stated if approved, hopefully be posted by the end of the year so we could get someone in to replace Shaw. Mayor Dillan asked when Jeff Shaw would retire and Chief Rasmussen stated in June of 2025. Chief Rasmussen stated that with the mid cars it does reduce overtime. Mayor Dillan asked about the liaison status. Chief Rasmussen explained that we just don't have the staff for a liaison. Discussion about posting the job sooner than later as it could take 6-9 months to get someone hired. Councilmember Gahm stated she was in favor of start looking.

Mayor Dillan said that council has time to think about this and if they think of anything, just email City Manager Pfaff.

City Manager Pfaff asked with the change of lowering the preliminary levy by \$30,000 – resulting in the 4.94 levy - if everyone was OK that. Everyone was OK with this as it was better than 8.

Adjourn:

Mayor Dillan called for a motion to adjourn. Motion made by Muller, seconded by Johnson to adjourn. No further discussion. All in favor, motion to adjourn passes. Meeting adjourned at 7:12 p.m.

Fire Department – Fire Chief Jesse Gerads stated their engine chassis is in and could be another 9-12 months before fire engine is ready. First Responders class will start in October for new members.

Township and city heads from Pease, Bock and Milaca will be on October 14 and our pumpkin open house is October 12.

Planning and Zoning – Ordinance #530 Permitted Accessory Uses in B-1 Central Business District-Tarp-Like Structures-First Reading. Mayor Dillan called for a motion to approve. Motion by Muller, seconded by Larsen. Mayor Dillan asked Johnson for an update. Johnson stated they are not allowed at all and this new ordinance would just be seasonal for flower growers and greenhouses that would fall into this. Johnson questioned if there was a discussion on the maximum size of 144 square feet. He questioned if that should be increased slightly to accommodate. City Manager Pfaff stated we did discuss this but you have to take into consideration of the impervious coverage and they decided on 144 square feet. Mayor Dillan asked if they had enough surface, they could increase the size if they stayed within zoning. Johnson stated most of the structures are 10 feet wide and a 10x16 would be a basic size or 10x20. If we could maybe look at that increase that up to 200 square feet. City Manager Pfaff then asked if Johnson would like to table this and bring it back to Planning and Zoning. Johnson stated it was past the season now so it wouldn't affect anything so we could table it until next Planning Commission. Johnson made a motion to table Ordinance #530 Permitted Accessory Uses in B-1 Central Business District-Tarp-Like Structures, seconded by Gahm. No further discussion. All in favor of tabling Permitted Accessory Uses in B-1 Central Business District-Tarp-Like Structures. Motion passes.

Planning and Zoning – Ordinance #531 Permitted Accessory Uses in B-2 General Business District-Tarp-Like Structures-First Reading. Johnson made a motion to table this Ordinance as well and send back to Planning and Zoning and review them at the same time, seconded by Larsen. No further discussion. All in favor of tabling Permitted Accessory Uses in B-2 General Business District-Tarp-Like Structures. Motion passes.

First Amendment to Lease between City of Milaca and Fairview Health Services-Motion by Gahm, seconded by Johnson. City Manager Pfaff stated that this would now be North Memorial so this current lease would term. No further discussion. All in favor. First Amendment to Lease between City of Milaca and Fairview Health Services passes.

Milaca Rec Fest & Activities Sponsorship Request-Mayor Dillan stated that we can't make a sponsorship but we can make a donation to the music that is being provided in the bandshell so we can make a donation to Milaca Rec Fest and Activities for their Milaca Country Fest and Jam that is being held in September. Gahm asked if this was from the Gambling Fund and Mayor Dillan stated yes and that it fits in the music community event category. Motion by Gahm, seconded by Johnson to make a donation to Milaca Rec Fest and Activities for their Milaca Country Fest and Jam . Larsen asked what amount would be donated. Mayor Dillan stated they were asking for \$500 or \$800. Gahm stated \$500. All in favor of donating \$500 to Milaca Rec Fest and Activities. Motion passes.

Letter of Support for ECE's Grid Resilience Formula Grant Program – Motion by Muller, seconded by Johnson. No further discussion. All in favor of the letter of support passes.

Donation for Cody Nelson – Eagle Scout project – Mayor Dillan stated Cody was asking for any donation. He has the support from Gary and this was for grills that would be going in Rec Park. City Manager Pfaff stated last time we picked up the offset of whatever he couldn't raise in donations. Larsen asked if we needed to set an amount to donate or what we need to do. City Manager suggested we make a recommendation that if he doesn't come up with enough that the city would purchase the grill. Mayor Dillan stated that he would raise money and the city would cover whatever was needed. Motion by Johnson, seconded by Gahm. No further discussion. All in favor. Motion passes.

Griffin Nelson-Eagle Scout Update – Griffin stated that he is working on an Eagle Project and would like to install a permanent fire pit in Trimble Park by the Veteran's Memorial so the American Legion has a place to do their flag retirement ceremonies. Gahm asked if it could be used for anything else or strictly for flags? Griffin stated the main purpose was for flag retirement ceremonies. Gary Kirkeby stated that

the top would have a lock on it. Griffin further stated that he needs the city's approval to put cement down for the base. Gahm asked where he was going to get the funding for this. Griffin stated the Legion would be covering this and he has other donations too. Muller asked if there would be a plaque on it indicating his project and Griffin stated there would be. Mayor Dillan called for a motion to support this project. Motion by Larsen, seconded by Gahm. No further discussion. All in favor of supporting this project. Motion passes.

Closed Meeting-Personnel Issue. – Mayor Dillan Read: The agenda item for this meeting is Personnel Data and Conduct. This portion of the properly notice meeting of the Milaca City Council will be closed pursuant to Minnesota Statutes under the Personnel Data and Conduct exception to the Minnesota Open Meeting Law. Pursuant to Minnesota Statute section 13(D).05 Subdivision 2 – the need for confidentiality out-weighs the purposes served by the open meeting law in this case based on the following: confidentiality is required to protect personnel data and conduct from becoming public at this time. The purpose of the closed meeting is not to make a decision behind closed doors but instead as to determine what actions are appropriate with respect to the personnel data and conduct, if any. The only business to be discussed in this portion of the meeting are the personnel data and conduct issues and what actions, if any, should be taken. I will now entertain a motion to close this portion of the meeting. Motion by Johnson, seconded by Gahm. All in favor. The council will now go in a closed session. Time is 6:53. Only the officials and consultants of the council who reasonably require access to this data may be in attendance at any portion of the meeting for this agenda item. The minutes of this portion of the meeting should reflect only that a meeting was held with its date, time and location, who was present at the meeting and the purpose of the meeting.

Regular council meeting opened at 7:40 p.m. Motion by Gahm, seconded by Larsen.

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Council Comments

§ 115.01 DEFINITIONS.

Except as may otherwise be provided or clearly implied by context, all terms shall be given their commonly accepted definitions. For the purpose of this chapter, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

PEDDLER. A person who goes from house-to-house, door-to-door, business-to-business, street-to-street, or any other type of place-to-place, for the purpose of offering for sale, displaying or exposing for sale, selling or attempting to sell, and delivering immediately upon sale, the goods, wares, products, merchandise or other personal property that the

person is carrying or otherwise transporting. The term PEDDLER shall mean the same as the term HAWKER.

PERSON. Any natural individual, group, organization, corporation, partnership, or association. As applied to groups, organizations, corporations, partnerships, and associations, the term shall include each member, officer, partner, associate, agent, or employee.

REGULAR BUSINESS DAY. Any day during which the City Hall is normally open for the purpose of conducting public business. Holidays defined by state law shall not be counted as REGULAR BUSINESS DAYS.

SOLICITOR. A person who goes from house-to-house, door-to-door, business-to-business, street-to-street, or any other type of place-to-place, for the purpose of obtaining or attempting to obtain orders for goods, wares, products, merchandise, other personal property, or services, of which he or she may be carrying or transporting samples, or that may be described in a catalog or by other means, and for which delivery or performance shall occur at a later time. The absence of samples or catalogs shall not remove a person from the scope of this provision if the actual purpose of the person's activity is to obtain or attempt to obtain orders as discussed above. The term shall mean the same as the term CANVASSER.

TRANSIENT MERCHANT. A person who temporarily sets up business out of a vehicle, trailer, boxcar, tent, other portable shelter, or empty storefront for the purpose of exposing or displaying for sale, selling or attempting to sell, and delivering, goods, wares, products, merchandise, or other personal property and who does not remain or intend to remain in any one location for more than 14 consecutive days.

MOBILE FOOD UNIT. A food and beverage service establishment that is a vehicle mounted unit, either motorized or trailered, and readily movable, without disassembling, for transport to another location. The unit can operate no more than 21 days annually at any one place unless it is operated at the site of and in conjunction with a permanent business licensed under Minnesota Statutes Chapter 157 or Chapter 28A. All mobile food units must be operated in compliance with the Minnesota Food Code.

§ 115.02 EXCEPTIONS TO DEFINITIONS.

(A) For the purpose of the requirements of this chapter, the terms PEDDLER, SOLICITOR, and TRANSIENT MERCHANT, and MOBILE FOOD UNIT shall not apply to any person selling or attempting to sell at wholesale any goods, wares, products, merchandise, or other personal property to a retailer of the items being sold by the wholesaler. The terms also shall not apply to any person who makes initial contacts with other people for the purpose of establishing or trying to establish a regular customer delivery route for the delivery of perishable food and dairy products such as baked goods and milk, nor shall they apply to

any person making deliveries of perishable food and dairy products to the customers on his or her established regular delivery route.

- (B) In addition, persons conducting the type of sales commonly known as garage sales, rummage sales, or estate sales, as well as those persons participating in an organized multiperson bazaar or flea market, shall be exempt from the definitions of PEDDLERS, SOLICITORS, and TRANSIENT MERCHANT, and MOBILE FOOD UNIT, as shall be anyone conducting an auction as a properly licensed auctioneer, or any officer of the court conducting a court-ordered sale. Exemption from the definitions for the scope of this chapter shall not excuse any person from complying with any other applicable statutory provision or local ordinance.
- (C) Persons going door to door selling or soliciting the sale of personal property or services, or soliciting money to raise funds for any local school, club, church, youth group or civic improvement activity is exempt from the definitions of PEDDLERS, SOLICITORS, and TRANSIENT MERCHANTS, and MOBILE FOOD UNITS.

§ 115.03 LICENSING; EXEMPTIONS.

- (A) City license required. Except as otherwise provided for by this chapter, no person shall conduct business as either a peddler, solicitor, or a transient merchant, or a mobile food unit without first having obtained a license from the city.
- (B) Application. Application for a city license to conduct business as a peddler, solicitor, or transient merchant, or mobile food unit shall be made at least 14 regular business days before the applicant desires to begin conducting business. Application for a license shall be made on a form approved by the City Council and available from the office of the City Manager-Clerk. All applications shall be signed by the applicant. All applications shall include the following information:
 - (1) Applicant's full legal name;
- (2) All other names under which the applicant conducts business or to which the applicant officially answers;
- (3) A physical description of the applicant (hair color, eye color, height, weight, distinguishing marks and features, and the like);
 - (43) Full address of applicant's permanent residence;
 - (54) Telephone number of applicant's permanent residence;
- (65) Full legal name of any and all business operations owned, managed, or operated by applicant, or for which the applicant is an employee or agent;

- (76) Full address of applicant's regular place of business (if any);
- (87) Any and all business related telephone numbers of the applicant;
- (98) The type of business for which the applicant is applying for a license;
- (109) Whether the applicant is applying for a monthly or daily license;
- (1110) The dates during which the applicant intends to conduct business, and if the applicant is applying for a daily license, the number of days he or she will be conducting business in the city (maximum 14 consecutive days or six month maximum);
- (1211) Any and all addresses and telephone numbers where the applicant can be reached while conducting business within the city, including the location where a transient merchant or mobile food unit intends to set up business;
- (1312) A statement as to whether or not the applicant has been convicted within the last five years of any felony, gross misdemeanor, or misdemeanor for violation of any state or federal statute or any local ordinance, other than traffic offenses;
- (1413) A list of the three most recent locations where the applicant has conducted business as a peddler, solicitor, or transient merchant, or mobile food unit;
- (1514) Written permission of the property owner or the property owner's agent for any property to be used by a transient merchant or mobile food unit;
 - (1615) A general description of the items to be sold or services to be provided;
 - (1716) All additional information deemed necessary by the City Council;
- (1817) A copy of Tthe applicant's driver's license number or other acceptable form of identification; and
- (1918) The license plate number, registration information, and vehicle identification number for any vehicle to be used in conjunction with the licensed business, and a description of the vehicle.
 - (19) Certificate of Insurance:
- (20) Copy of MN Department of Health or Department of Agriculture License; and
 - (21) Completed and signed Background Investigation Consent Form;
- (C) Fee. All applications for a license under this chapter shall be accompanied by the fee established in Chapter 34 of this code, as it may be amended from time to time.
- (D) Procedure. Upon receipt of the completed application and payment of the license fee, the City Manager-Clerk must determine if the application is complete. An application is determined to be complete only if all required information is provided. If the Manager-Clerk determines that the application is incomplete, the Manager-Clerk must inform the applicant of the required necessary information that is missing. If the application is complete, the Manager-Clerk must order any investigation, including background checks,

necessary to verify the information provided with the application. Upon completion of the background check, the Manager-Clerk must issue the license unless there exists grounds for denying the license under § 115.04, in which case the Manager-Clerk must deny the license. If the Manager-Clerk denies the license, the applicant must be notified in writing via letter or email of the decision, the reason for denial, and of the applicant's right to appeal the denial by requesting, within 20 days of receiving notice of rejection, a public hearing before the City Council. The City Council shall hear the appeal within 20 days of the date of the request. The decision of the City Council following the public hearing can be appealed by petitioning the State Court of Appeals for a writ of certiorari.

- (E) Duration. All licenses granted under this chapter shall be valid only during the time period indicated on the license.
 - (F) License exemptions.
- (1) No license shall be required for any person to sell or attempt to sell, or to take or attempt to take orders for, any product grown, produced, cultivated, or raised on any farm.
- (2) No license shall be required of any person going from house-to-house, door-to-door, business-to-business, street-to-street, or other type of place-to-place when the activity is for the purpose of exercising that person's state or federal Constitutional rights such as the freedom of speech, press, religion, and the like, except that this exemption may be lost if the person's exercise of Constitutional rights is merely incidental to a commercial activity.
- (3) Professional fundraisers working on behalf of an otherwise exempt person or group shall not be exempt from the licensing requirements of this chapter.

§ 115.04 LICENSE INELIGIBILITY.

The following shall be grounds for denying a license under this chapter:

- (A) The failure of the applicant to truthfully provide any of the information requested by the city as a part of the application, or the failure to sign the application, failure to pass a background check, or the failure to pay the required fee at the time of application;
 - (B) The conviction of the applicant within the past five years from the date of application for any violation of any federal or state statute or regulation, or of any local ordinance, which adversely reflects on the person's ability to conduct the business for which the license is being sought in an honest and legal manner. Those violations shall include but not be limited to burglary, theft, larceny, swindling, fraud, unlawful business practices, and any form of actual or threatened physical harm against another person;

- (C) The revocation within the past five years of any license issued to the applicant for the purpose of conducting business as a peddler, solicitor, or transient merchant, or mobile food unit; or
- (D) The applicant is found to have a bad business reputation. Evidence of a bad business reputation shall include, but not be limited to, the existence of more than three complaints against the applicant with the Better Business Bureau, the Attorney General's Office, or other similar business or consumer rights office or agency, within the preceding 12 months, or three complaints filed against the applicant within the preceding five years.

§ 115.05 LICENSE SUSPENSION AND REVOCATION.

- (A) Generally. Any license issued under this chapter may be suspended or revoked at the discretion of the <u>City Manager-Clerk or</u> City Council for violation of any of the following:
 - (1) Fraud, misrepresentation, or incorrect statements on the application form;
- (2) Fraud, misrepresentation, or false statements made during the course of the licensed activity;
- (3) Conviction of any offense for which granting of a license could have been denied under § 115.04; or
 - (4) Violation of any provision of this chapter.
- (B) Multiple persons under one license. The suspension or revocation of any license issued for the purpose of authorizing multiple persons to conduct business as peddlers, solicitors, or transient merchants, or mobile food units on behalf of the licensee shall serve as a suspension or revocation of each authorized person's authority to conduct business as a peddler, solicitor, or transient merchants, or mobile food units on behalf of the licensee whose license is suspended or revoked.
- (C) Notice. Prior to revoking or suspending any license issued under this chapter or right to solicit business within the city, the city shall provide the license holder or solicitor with written notice of the alleged violations and inform the licensee or solicitor of his or her right to a hearing on the alleged violation. Notice shall be delivered in person, by email, or by mail to the permanent residential address listed on the license application, or if no residential address is listed, to the business address provided on the license application.
 - (C) Public hearing. Upon receiving the notice provided in division (C) of this section, the licensee shall have the right to request a public hearing. If no request for a hearing is received by the City Manager-Clerk within ten regular business days following the service of the notice, the city may proceed with the suspension or revocation. For the

purpose of mailed notices, service shall be considered complete as of the date the notice is placed in the mail. If a public hearing is requested within the stated time frame, a hearing shall be scheduled within 20 days from the date of the request. Within three regular business days of the hearing, the City Council shall notify the licensee of its decision.

- (E) Emergency. If, in the discretion of the <u>City Manager-Clerk or</u> City Council, imminent harm to the health or safety or economic interests of the public may occur because of the actions of a peddler, solicitor or transient merchant, whether licensed or unlicensed under this chapter, <u>City Manager-Clerk or</u> the City Council may immediately suspend the person's license, if any, or right to solicit business within the city and provide notice of the right to show cause at a subsequent public hearing as prescribed in division (C) of this section why the license or right to solicit business in the city should not be terminated.
- (F) Appeals. Any person whose license is suspended or revoked under this section shall have the right to appeal that decision in court.

§ 115.06 LICENSE TRANSFERABILITY.

No license issued under this chapter shall be transferred to any person other than the person to whom the license was issued.

Penalty, see § 10.99

§ 115.07 PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES.

No peddler, solicitor, or transient merchants, or mobile food units shall conduct business in any of the following manners:

- (A) Calling attention to his or her business or items to be sold by means of blowing any horn or whistle, ringing any bell, crying out, or by any other noise, so as to be unreasonably audible within an enclosed structure;
- (B) Obstructing the free flow of either vehicular or pedestrian traffic on any street, alley, sidewalk, or other public right-of-way;
- (C) Conducting business in a way as to create a threat to the health, safety, and welfare of any individual or the general public;
 - (D) Conducting business before 10:00 a.m. or after 8:00 p.m.;
 - (E) Failing to provide proof of license or registration, and identification, when requested; or using the license or registration of another person;

- (F) Making any false or misleading statements about the product or service being sold, including untrue statements of endorsement. No peddler, solicitor, or transient merchants, or mobile food units shall claim to have the endorsement of the city solely based on the city having issued a license or certificate of registration to that person; or
- (G) Remaining on the property of another when requested to leave, or to otherwise conduct business in a manner a reasonable person would find obscene, threatening, intimidating, or abusive.

(H) Restrictions on Mobile Food Units

- (1) Mobile food units are prohibited from vending activity on any public street or private property within 150' of the nearest property line of any restaurant within the City of Milaca.
- (2) Mobile food units are prohibited from vending activities within 300' of a community event for which the City has issued a Special Event Permit, unless they are specifically authorized by the event sponsor to participate in the event. The terms of the Special Event Permit shall apply.
- (3) Mobile food units are allowed to operate on private property as expressly authorized by the owner/manager/agent of the private property.

§ 115.08 EXCLUSION BY PLACARD.

No peddler, solicitor, or transient merchants, or mobile food units, unless invited to do so by the property owner or tenant, shall enter the property of another for the purpose of conducting business as a peddler, solicitor, or transient merchants, or mobile food units when the property is marked with a sign or placard at least four inches long and four inches wide with print of at least 48 point in size stating "No Peddlers, Solicitors, or Transient Merchants, or Mobile Food Units or "Peddlers, Solicitors, and Transient Merchants, and Mobile Food Units Prohibited," or other comparable statement. No person other than the property owner or tenant shall remove, deface, or otherwise tamper with any sign or placard under this section.

Penalty, see § 10.99

§ 115.99 VIOLATIONS; CONVICTIONS.

A violation of any provision of this chapter are subject to penalties under § 10.99 punishable as a misdemeanor with a fine of \$250 and each day the violation occurs is a separate offense.

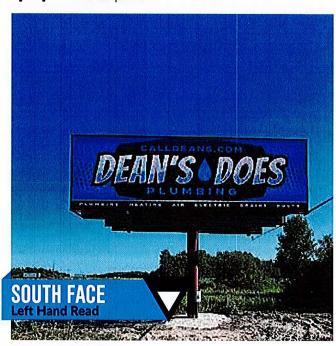

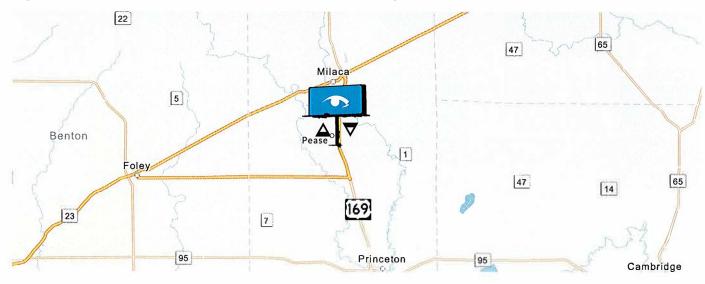
